Stanway Singers

The Vocabulary Club

If you love reading, writing and language, this is the club for you! Students who are interested in attending The Vocabulary Club will develop a love of language by exploring the morphology (how words are formed) and etymology (the origin of a word and the historical development of its meaning) of challenging/sophisticated words. Students will get the chance to read stories and extracts from a range of subjects and develop their vocabulary through a variety of fun activities. Students will be able to create word maps, build display boards, enjoy quizzes and many more activities. There will be competitions and prizes. No previous experience is required, just an interest in improving vocabulary and learning ambitious words!

Read Around The World

A reading challenge to discover more about the world around us. Students will get a choice of geographical fiction and non-fiction books to read, or they can identify their own, once they have read the book they will be asked to write a review of the book identifying key facts and information. The challenge will be to travel to as many places via books as possible.

Homework club

Every night from 3.15-4.00 in the LRC teach area, and is manned by an LSA every evening. The LRC can be used by all students for homework after school.

STEM Club

STEM Club provides the opportunity for students in year 7 and 8 to carry out various fun activities linked to STEM subjects. This includes building rockets, electronics projects, hot air balloons, projectiles and fun with chemicals.
