The Literacy and Numeracy Catch-Up Premium provides schools with an additional £500 for each Year 7 pupil who did not achieve at least the minimum standard in English and/or Maths at the end of Key Stage 2. It is given to close the gap between these students and their peers.

Key Priorities 2018/19

- 1. Provide intervention programs to ensure students at least meet the expected standard in English and Maths
- 2. To increase the number of students meeting the expected standard by the end of year 7 in Maths.
- 3. Provide additional support for eligible students to ensure their mental and social well-being and develop their self-confidence.
- 4. Ensure that all students have access to a diverse and rich curriculum.
