

## THE STANWAY SCHOOL: YEAR 7 CATCH UP PREMIUM IMPACT ANALYSIS 2017-18

The Literacy and Numeracy Catch-Up Premium provides schools with an additional £500 for each Year 7 pupil who did not achieve at least the minimum standard in English and/or Maths at the end of Key Stage 2. It is given to close the gap between these students and their peers.

### Key Priorities 2018/19

1. Provide intervention programs to ensure students at least meet the expected standard in English and Maths
2. To increase the number of students meeting the expected standard by the end of year 7 in Maths.
3. Provide additional support for eligible students to ensure their mental and social well-being and develop their self-confidence.
4. Ensure that all students have access to a diverse and rich curriculum.
