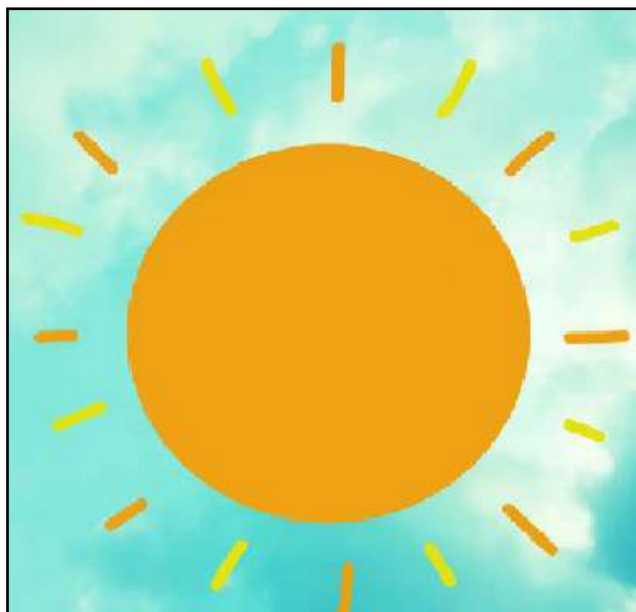
NATIONAL GYMNASTICS SUCCESS FOR CHARLIE
