- Mary Seacole a British-Jamaican nurse and businesswoman who set up the "British Hotel" behind the lines during the Crimean War with her own money





DO NOT ENTER THE "GRIME SCENE" !

Year 7 food students took part in an activity this week, involving naming hazards that can be found in a kitchen or in the food room – the "grime scene". They identified equipment, learned how to weigh and measure correctly, washed up properly and researched healthy eating.













Sexual harassment takes many forms. All of them need to be stopped.

CrimeStoppers have commissioned a major piece of research, working in partnership with the University of Suffolk Centre for Abuse Research, and have launched an anonymous survey: 'Safe in public: understanding how sexual harassment affects people's use of public space'.

The aim of this research is to learn more about people's experiences of sexual harassment in public spaces, how people think we should talk about these behaviours, and how people think we should respond to these behaviours to make public spaces safe and accessible. The findings from this research will become the cornerstone of a national campaign the charity will run later this year, focusing on challenging perpetrator behaviour and working to take a stand against sexual harassment in all its forms.

To make this research really count, they need 2000 responses, therefore you are invited to complete the survey, which should take around 10-15 minutes.
