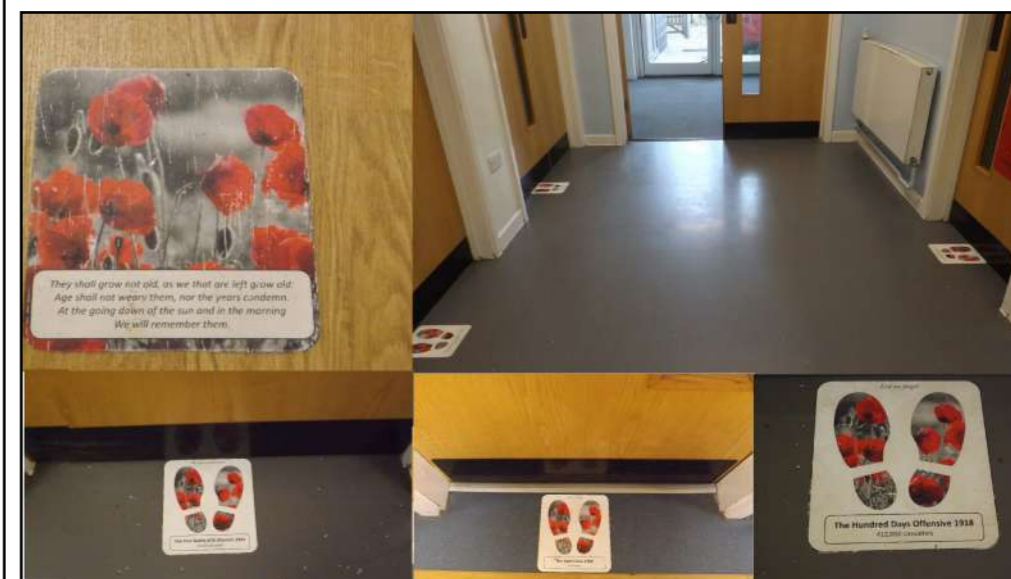

### THE STANWAY SCHOOL REMEMBERS THE FALLEN WITH POIGNANT FOOTPRINTS

Pupils and staff in the school were encouraged to remember those who sacrificed their lives in all wars on Remembrance Day, with the placing of 'footprints' in corridors and entrances to classrooms, that had the names of individual battles with the number of fatalities for each. These were designed to give us the chance to 'walk in the shoes' of, and reflect on those lost, in all wars since the First World War.

Those in the school also observed the 2 minute silence at 11am. The focus of assemblies during the week was 'service and sacrifice then and now', which looked at the service and sacrifice of people during war and in difficult times like the current Covid pandemic.

Students who are members of uniformed services such as the Cadets, Scouts, Guides, St Johns Ambulance etc were invited to wear their uniform as an act of respect for the day.

## DISTRICT CROSS COUNTRY SUCCESS

The Stanway School competed in the recent Colchester District Cross Country Championships, held for the first time at the new Northern Gateway, opposite the Colchester United Stadium. The purpose built sports venue was perfect for the event and may be hosting many of the School District competitions in the future.

As with all Cross Country events, there were both individual and team competitions. Each school entered teams of up to 6 runners, with the first 4 scoring points. The best 4 runners' scores are added together to give the teams total. The lowest overall total wins.

The individual competition allows the best 10 runners to get a possible selection to represent North Essex in the Essex Championships which are due to be held later in the year.

All students who represented our school did a great job, with some particularly good individual performances where 5 of our students managed to get into the top 10! In the first event, Ben took an early lead and managed to hold off the whole field and win the Year 7 boys event. Next Ella came 8th in the Year 7 girls event. In the Year 10/11 events, Rachel gained a 10th place finish in the girls event, Blake came 10th and Cameron 4th in the boys event.

Again well done to all of those that took part and good luck to the 5 athletes that may have the chance to represent North Essex in the Essex Championships.
