NO HORSING AROUND FOR STANWAY STUDENTS!

Megan in Year 11 was back in the saddle representing The Stanway School in arena eventing - an exciting equine discipline, combining show jumps and cross country style jumps, in a battle to avoid faults and race the clock.

Megan's first round was the 80cm class, guiding Yogi around the course in style, before her and Rocky competed in the 90cm and 1m classes. After a long warm up, which was needed in the cold wind, Megan rode through the gate and onto the course - her face alight with a smile. After a quick inspection of the fences, the bell rang and they were off. Skilfully Megan was able to apply the pressure to keep Rocky under control. The pair navigated the course with a clear round. No fences knocked down and Megan and the Stanway School achieved 3rd place. This means for the first time, the Stanway School equestrian team have earned a place in the national finals, where schools across the UK compete against each other to be crowned NSEA champion.

Megan and Rocky then performed in the 1m class. As the difficulty of the courses increases, fewer riders enter. It's not only the physical element of controlling the horse but also the cognitive element of remembering the course(this was now Megan's 3rd on the day) that makes equine disciplines so difficult.

Rather unexpectedly, Megan's name was announced.—she had won the plate championship—for the third consecutive year! Another fantastic achievement!

MR BLAND'S BLACK HISTORY MONTH HEROES

For this last week in October, I thought I would highlight another hero of mine: Romelu Lukaku. Lukaku (a.k.a The Beast!) was born in Belgium in 1993 and has gone on to be one of the most successful footballers in recent times.



I am particularly keen on his footballing skills because I am a Chelsea supporter, so I have seen him at the club in his two spells with us, once in 2011 and now in 2021, when he joined the club again from Inter Milan.

His record for scoring goals speaks for itself. He is now Belgium's all-time top goal scorer, and he is only 28 years old. I am sure that record will stand for a long time. He first joined Chelsea Football Club in 2011, but he did not get many chances to play, and during his time at Stamford Bridge, he failed to score at the home ground. He went on loan to West Bromwich Albion and then to Everton, where he later joined that club permanently in 2014.

It was there that his success really started to build, and he was later sold to Manchester United for £75m before moving to Inter Milan in 2019 for £68m,

where he won the Serie A title.

The reason he stands out for me is that he never stopped believing in his ability and never stopped working hard to achieve his dream; to one day return to Chelsea and score in front of the home fans at Stamford Bridge, the thing he was not able to do during his first spell at the club.

In the summer of 2021, he rejoined Chelsea for a club record fee of £97.5m, making him the world's top player for having the most amount of money spent on him across his career.



Then, on 11th September, Lukaku scored his first goal for Chelsea at Stamford Bridge in a 3-0 win over Aston Villa. Ten years after first joining Chelsea, his childhood dream of scoring for Chelsea was fulfilled, but only through the hard work and determination to succeed. This is a photo of him celebrating that famous goal.

For this reason, I think Romelu's achievements are worth celebrating.

WINSTREE ROAD - COMMUNITY LED STREET DESIGN

Most of you will remember the series of engagement events and street trials that took place along Winstree Road over the last 18 months. These were run in partnership with Essex County Council (ECC), Essex Highways (EH) and the cycling and walking charity Sustrans, to look at the traffic levels and congestion experienced during peak school drop off and collection times. ECC are pleased to report that they're now making permanent some of those ideas which proved popular, and are confident they will result in lower traffic, cleaner air and safer roads for our children walking, cycling and scooting to school. The first set of improvements will take place during the October half-term (w/c 25 October), and will consist of improving the shape and width of the pavements at certain points, and enhancing some surfaces to make them better for walking and cycling.

As a slightly separate piece of work, the footpath that runs between Villa Road through to Tollgate Hall Car Park will also be widened and completed on 08/11/2021. On the 08/11/2021 final surfacing work will be undertaken during daytime restricted working hours, to avoid children going in and out of school.

All these early improvements will provide a physical difference to those who use Winstree Road regularly and we hope will encourage more use of walking, cycling and scooting.

More work is planned for the February 2022 half-term and into Spring/Summer 2022 and we will update you early next year about this.

We would like to thank everybody who gave us their input and helped shape the Winstree Road School Street. We hope it becomes a trailblazer for other school streets in Essex over the coming months.
