After winning this competition last year it was going to be a nail-biting and challenging task to retain the honour, but all our students were ready to take on the challenge. It was a great opportunity for our students to test themselves during three demanding rounds of some extremely atypical maths problems.

All the students worked exceptionally hard and we were very impressed by all those who participated. After just one hour of intensive thinking the results were revealed.

Stanway managed to retain the title in a very competitive race with the other two teams finishing 12th and 14th, which is a great achievement considering they were short of numbers due to last minute unavailability.

Students have learnt how to call 999 and practise answers to the types of questions they would be asked, how to cope in an emergency and also how to use the DRSABC action plan (Danger, Response, Shout/Summon help, Airway, Breathing, CPR).

They have learnt how to perform CPR, how to use a defibrillator, when to use the recovery position, as well as dealing with choking, bleeding, asthma attacks and anaphylaxis.

I am extremely proud of them all and we now have 22 students in the school who have their Student First Aid Level 1 certificate.
