GCSE POETRY LIVE - LONDON

On Friday 24th January, a group of staff took Year 10 students for an exciting trip to London to listen to poets walk about the poems in the GCSE anthology. The venue was at the Apolo in Victoria. It was great being able to see and watch poets, who previously has just been names in an anthology, perform beneath the huge dragon! Students also had the opportunity to get advice from the Chief Examiner about how to tackle unseen poetry. Students listened to a former poet laureate, Carol Ann Duffy and the present poet laureate, Simon Armitage. Simon is one of Britain's best poets, with a superb ear for language. This was a great opportunity to hear the Oxford Professor of Poetry read his work from the anthology. Carol Ann Duffy and Gillian Clarke gave an exhilarating joint reading. Their session was one of the most illuminating parts of the day for us. Carol Ann Duffy is one of the most read, studied and loved poets of today and such an inspired choice for the role of Poet Laureate. Her poems were sharp, funny, contemporary and also full of a literary past, whether from mythology, or Shakespeare. John Agard gave one of the most exciting performances in contemporary poetry, not only in the way he delivered his poems, but also in how he talked about them, combining historical awareness, cultural insight and extraordinary humour. Imitaz Dharker, Maura Dooley, Daljit Nagra, Owen Sheers and Grace Nicols read their work. Poets responded to student questions and discussed how poems connect to and influence other poems. The examiner sessions with a highly experienced Chief Examiner dealt with two skills vital for success in the GCSE English Literature examinations. The day ended with John Agard explaining why he wrote 'Checkin' out me History' and 'Half-Castle'. We would like to thank all the staff involved, especially Miss Jones. It was a brilliant trip and we wish all of the Year 10 students well in their future mock examinations.
