

This is a fantastic idea, and will keep going indefinitely to ensure that fewer and fewer people in the Stanway School community continue to use single-use plastics.

These bottles are on sale for £8.50 from the school via ParentPay to any student or member of staff. Designed with the school logo proudly showing, these really look great, but they also will have a long lasting effect on the school's carbon footprint.
