Girlguiding Essex North East is entitled to elect Jack Petchey Achievement Award winners. Recipients must have contributed to Girlguiding or the community in a significant way or for personal developments and positive personality traits.

Mia, a Year 8 student, was nominated by 1st West Bergholt Guides and is the proud winner of this award. Her Guider said: "Mia is a great role model to the younger girls and has a positive impact on guiding. She has an excellent attendance for the weekly meetings and outside events. She is always ready to help, not only when asked and not only for the plum jobs. Mia is unfailingly well mannered and polite. During lockdown she kept busy and suggested (and helped) raising money for the Australian bush fire fund by auctioning the purchase of badges. She completed every section of the Commissioners' Challenge and attended every session of our virtual online guiding from March until the summer break".

Mia says: "I am over the moon to have received a Jack Petchey award for guides because of my outstanding attitude towards guiding. I have also been a good role model to the younger ones, been extremely helpful to my leaders and attended all of the meetings. During lockdown I completed every section of the badge work and even completed extra as I volunteered to help my dad deliver essential items to the vulnerable in the community and was lucky enough to be awarded a certificate of thanks for this. We sent out letters to key workers to help them get through this pandemic. I also let my brother attend the meetings as a 'honorary guide'. I attended church via Zoom on Remembrance Sunday and also painted poppy rocks which I placed outside the church".

COMMUNITY PLAQUE AWARD

After making scrub bags and ear savers for the NHS and care homes back in April and May, the Secret Sewing Club then started making a few fabric face coverings with the leftover sheets and duvets. A national initiative was set up in Wiltshire where the masks were hung on trees for the public to choose from and leave a donation if they wished to.

Fast forward six months and the sewing team, with help from a few local friends, have made nearly 17,000 masks and the Colchester Trees have raised over £35,000 for various local charities. We were nominated for the Community Plaque Award by the local community and we were grateful to receive our certificate and plaque from the Mayoress a couple of weeks ago.
