### **DUKE OF EDINBURGH AWARD - PRINCE PHILIP'S LEGACY**

Duke of Edinburgh Award: When Prince Philip started the DofE scheme, and how it inspired millions of people

HRH The Prince Philip, Duke of Edinburgh, was the founder and patron of the DofE. As well as his military service and longstanding royal service to her Majesty the Queen, the Duke of Edinburgh's Award is likely to be one of Prince Philip's greatest legacies.

Philip was a passionate believer in the spirit of adventure and the limitless potential of young people. Generations of young people have had the opportunity to take on the life changing challenge of a DofE Award.

Philip was inspired to start the scheme by his eccentric headmaster, Dr Kurt Hahn, and his much-loved school days at Gordonstoun in north-east Scotland. He launched a scheme at the school called the Moray Badge, aimed at giving post-war youngsters in Britain a

sense of achievement. The project was launched in 1956 with the Duke as patron, initially aimed at offering young men activities to complete between leaving education and starting National Service. This was followed by the scheme being offered to include girls in 1958, which was progressive in offering equal opportunities at that time in British history.

Aimed at both able-bodied and disabled youngsters, the award became one of the best known self-development and adventure schemes for 14-24 year olds. It involves four challenges for young people to complete, to help their community and environment, become fitter, develop new skills and complete an independent outdoor expedition. The

skills and personal attributes that are gained through the DofE can provide young people with the edge when making applications for college, university and potential employers.

More than six million young people have participated in the scheme in the UK with over three million achieving awards. Millions of others have taken part across the globe with more than 140 countries and territories running DofE programmes.



Prince Edward, Earl of Wessex, is expected to take on his father's responsibilities with the scheme as he is already a trustee and heavily involved in the organisation. In July 2018, students from schools in north east Essex, including Stanway, were invited to meet Prince Edward at Prested Hall, Feering to discuss the challenges they had achieved and their expedition experiences in completing their Bronze

In October 2013 the Duke celebrated the 500th Gold Award presentation ceremony and characteristically joked with one group: "You were meant to suffer, it's good for the soul."

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The Duke of Edinburgh Award scheme is undoubtedly Prince Philip's enduring legacy that he leaves for the benefit of young people.

Thank you, Your Royal Highness, for the incredible legacy you leave through DofE, empowering young people across the world with the skills, confidence and resilience to make the most of life and make a difference to the world around them.
