Groundworkers – Level 2 Apprenticeship (x5)

Groundworkers prepare the sites ready for the structural building works to take place. They continue their work throughout the construction phase, working with all on-site construction trades, such as bricklayers and plant operatives, up to and including the final completion activities of the project.

Through this apprenticeship you will learn how to work safely and securely, access interpret and use drawings and specifications, use and maintain a range of power tools and equipment (compactor plates, boning rods, portable power tools, levels, straight edges, lines, pins and laser equipment), mix mortars and concrete by hand and by mixer, use basic setting out equipment including tape measures, levels, straight edges, lines and pins, basic drainage and ducting, transport and place, compact and finish concrete to slabs/bases, footing oversights, paths, form slab edgings including positioning reinforcement and kerbs, set out and lay flags, paviours and edging to paths, driveways and other areas, install ironworks relating to access covers and frames, and gully grates and frames including preparatory brickwork, locate and excavate to expose buried utilities, form and reinstate excavations and surfaces to sub-grades, sub-bases and road bases.

Apprentice Groundworkers need to be physically fit and ideally able to drive or at least looking to drive soon.

All students who are at 'OFFER' and 'ACCEPT' (with the exception of Foundation Learning STEPS applicants) will be sent a link and asked to log into their account to upload a photo of themselves for their College ID Card and a photo of their ID so that Colchester Institute can verify students identity (once they have verified students ID, this photo will be deleted from their system to ensure compliance with GDPR).

INDUCTION DAYS - CHANGE OF DATES

Colchester Sixth Form College will write to you in May with details of the Induction Programme that they anticipate will take place on either Tuesday 22 June or Wednesday 23 June.

Induction will provide a welcome to the College and an opportunity for you to meet staff, work with some of the subject departments and get to know your fellow tutees. This day is an important step in the process of becoming familiar with the College and they very much hope that you will be able to attend. Induction is always an exciting time for the college and they are looking forward to welcoming students.

Please note that Covid-19 arrangements have required us to move this event from previously published dates and clearly there is the possibility that further disruption may occur, although they will attempt to keep such disruption to a minimum and inform you of any changes as soon as possible. They fully understand that attendance at Induction may present difficulties for some students, given the high levels of uncertainty about a range of scheduled events in the summer. They would urge you to contact the college nearer the time if there are concerns regarding your attendance.

GCSE GRADES AND ENTRY CRITERIA

As you may be aware, precise details regarding how GCSE and other grades will be awarded have only gradually been released by the Government. They do, however, assume that students will be awarded GCSE grades in summer 2021 and that these grades will be in a format identical to those issued in previous years. In this context, the College plans to adhere to the entry criteria discussed at interview, published in the College Prospectus and online at the start of the application process.

POST-GCSE COUNSELLING

As you may be aware, GCSE results day has been brought forward to 12th August this year. If you would like to discuss your results when they are released, especially if they are likely to have a significant effect upon your choice of courses, a range of staff will be available for support on 12th and 13th August. The college will email details of how to access support nearer the time.

T Levels: A new career focused alternative to A levels

T Levels are a new qualification for students aged 16 to 19 who've finished GCSEs. They are the biggest reform to vocational training in a generation, giving young people the skills, knowledge, and attitude to excel in their careers. They will suit students who wish to start working towards a skilled occupation, prefer a practical approach to learning and want a predominantly classroom-based course.

With T Level being equivalent to 3 A Levels, T Level graduates will have opportunities to move straight into work, to further study or an apprenticeship.

What skills are available? Over the next few years, T Levels will scale to include 24 courses, covering [11 skill areas](#).

Can I get the financial support I need?

If you have a disability, health condition (including mental health conditions) or a specific learning difficulty, you may be entitled to claim extra financial help as a student.

Throughout this magazine we hope to help you break down barriers and dispel beliefs that as a disabled person you do not have the option of Further or Higher Education or support to access it.
