

2021/2022 Covid-19 Changes

How can I work towards The Stanway Experience despite coronavirus?

We have made some changes to the experiences that you are allowed to do for each category for the 2021/2022 year **only**. Remember, The Stanway Experience is split into **5** different **categories**. These categories are:



- **Explore** is about the school trips you attend.
- Contribute is about volunteer work you do in school and outside of school.
- Engage is about going above and beyond by taking part in school events/experiences.
- **Develop** is about learning <u>new</u> skills.
- Appreciate is about broadening your knowledge of the subjects you study.

Category	Current description	For 2021/2022 this will also include
Explore	 Any school residential in the UK/abroad. Any school half day, day or evening trip in the UK/abroad. 	Recording one outside of school trip/holiday. Ideally this should build on something you have learnt in school. Example 1: Travelling to France to ski at Christmas with your family and practicing French language skills. Example 2: Going for a day trip with your family to Duxford imperial war museum and learning about World War Two and the aircraft involved. Example 3: Going to watch an outdoor live performance of a musical or play.
		A piece of evidence <u>must</u> be provided e.g. a picture of you or a letter from a parent/carer.

Contribute	 Any volunteer work completed in school. Any volunteer work completed outside of school. Remember! For outside of school volunteer work you MUST provide evidence to prove this. 	None.
Engage	 Taking part in a school event/experience outside the normal day to day expectations of a student. 	None.
Develop	 Learning a new skill. Remember! You MUST provide evidence to prove this and it must be a new skill. 	None.
Appreciate	 Attending a school trip that broadens knowledge of a particular subject area. Participating in an experience that broadens knowledge of a particular subject area. 	Recording one outside of school trip, holiday or online experience. This must show how you have built on something you have learnt in school. Example 1: Going on a day trip to a historical monument, improving your knowledge of an event or period of time you studied in a History lesson. Example 2: Going on a trip with your family to take part in a cooking masterclass session with a chef, that builds on the skills you learnt cooking a dish in a food lesson e.g. a pizza or bread. Example 3: Watching a theatre performance of Macbeth via an online stream. A piece of evidence must be provided e.g. a picture of you or a letter from a parent/carer.
