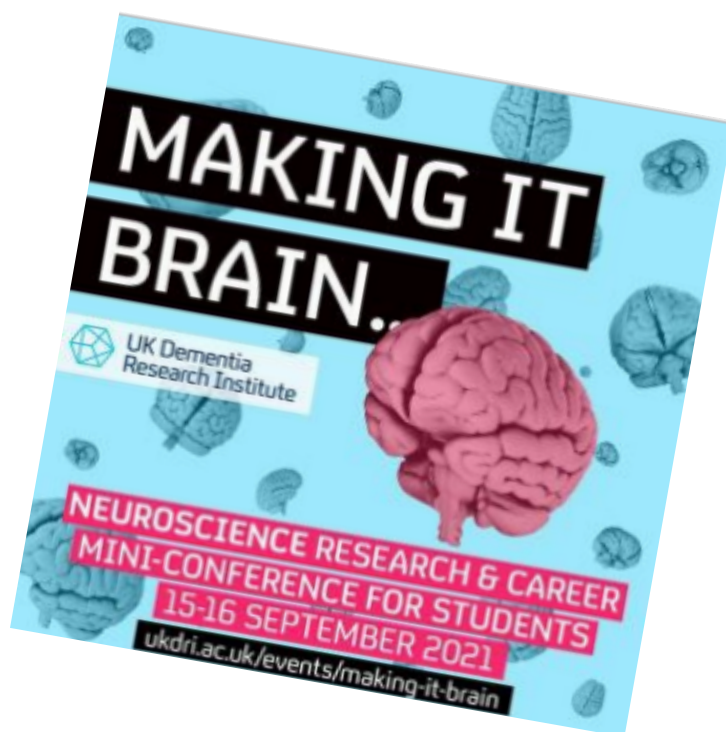
Current Year 10 Students

We are a group of doctors passionate about inspiring the next generation of students into Medicine and healthcare. We run an online interactive weekly Anatomy club covering live virtual dissection of various human body systems, how they work and what could go wrong. We've been running sessions throughout the pandemic and received great feedback, so we wanted to reach out to more keen students. We wanted to let you know about some of the programs we are running over the Summer Holidays:

Our sessions are aimed at students aged 14+ interested in a career in Healthcare and certificates will be provided for participation as virtual work experience.

How to save a life interactive seminar – Free online on Thursday 29th July 2021 6pm-8pm

In this session we will teach the principles of life support. How healthcare professionals assess and treat unwell patients. We will also go through some interactive scenarios. The session is delivered by fully qualified medical doctors.

***NEW* MedicineLive – interactive virtual clinic – £95 online on Saturday 21st August 2021 10am – 5pm**

1. An insight into the training medical doctors undertake
2. A day in the life of a medic
3. Live examination demo – students will receive their own stethoscope via post and learn how to examine different body systems
4. Live virtual clinic. Follow along as we go step by step on how doctors take histories, interpret blood results, ECGs and scans
5. A chance to interact and speak with practising medical doctors

We aim to make our courses as interactive as possible to give students a real taste of what it is like to be a doctor and to be in the clinic room using the latest innovative virtual technology. Students will also get a chance to learn how to examine the human body with their own stethoscope.

- George Anderson - Wellbeing Coach, Gen. Healthy Minds

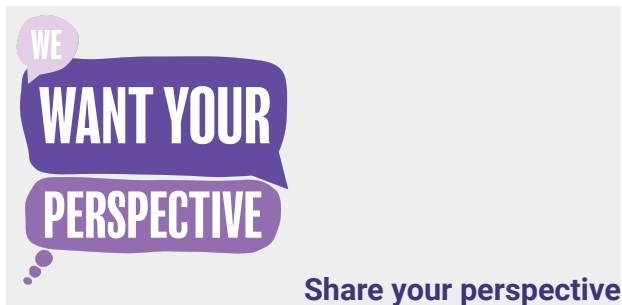
