SUMMER CITIZENSHIP ACTION PROJECT

Giving our students a platform to voice their concerns and issues is something we value at our school and this was evident in our 'Year 8 Citizenship Action Project.'

Students worked in groups to choose issues in society that they felt they wanted to make others aware of or try to improve. There was a range of ideas and some excellent research took place. Students contacted their local MP's, charities and business for their project. Some of the work produced has been added to displays around the school.

One particular group—Chantilly, Monty, Ella and Castara focused on 'Animal Rights' and Chantilly had this to say: "We each chose different sub-issues to research: animal poaching, testing, and abuse. Through this research we have learnt that hundreds of animals across the globe experience abuse from their owners; over 100 million animals are burned, crippled, poisoned, and abused in US labs every year, and poachers are killing an average of at least 2 animals per day. Poaching will cause the species to suffer and stop evolution, as it weakens their genetics. Animals that have suffered from abuse deal with psychological damage and emotional pain that stays with them for the rest of their lives. We also learnt that 92% of experimental drugs that are safe and effective in animals fail in human clinical trials because they are too dangerous or don't work. As a group we reached out to three different organisations: IAPF, The Living Planet Centre and The John Hopkins Centre for Alternatives to Animal Testing, to learn ways we can help within our local and school community."

It is fantastic to see so many of our students taking an active part in our community.

SUMMER SCHOOL READING CHALLENGE


