In amongst the surrealism of a national TV documentary being played to millions of people, was the opportunity that inspired us in the first place to get involved in this project - to bring this important conversation to the mainstream.

Many parents across the country have felt isolated when deciding about their children's use of these devices and have even felt peer pressure to allow their usage at younger and younger ages. I know first hand how difficult this situation can be, as a parent of two 12 year olds that are also very fond of their smartphones! But, this documentary was never about blame or judgment; instead about giving us all a chance to reflect on a technological world that emerged before we even stopped to question whether we were ok with it. Now, that conversation is being had in homes across the country.

As a starting point, this will involve parental workshops that are being built to help raise awareness of what we can all do to help our young people. The details will be with you very soon.

Back in the real world, this week life has gotten very real for some of our Year 11 students, with the release of the Art final examination content and even the first actual examination being sat just this morning by a select group of Business Studies students. For the rest of the year group, we look towards the Mock Results being issued next Friday morning!
